A long syllable = a **long vowel** or a **vowel followed by two consonants** (even if they are in the next word, or one of them is)

A short syllable = a **short vowel followed by another vowel or only one consonant**

## NOTES

- ▶ A vowel at the end of a word is elided before a word starting with a vowel or H. This also applies to words ending in -M. This final syllable, which was only lightly pronounced if at all, is **ignored in the scansion of the line**.
- ▶ X and Z count as **two consonants**
- ▶ Diphthongs (ae, au, oe, eu) count as **long vowels**
- ▶ B, C, D, F, G, P, or T followed by R or L can count as **one or two consonants**

## KEY ENDINGS

-a    Short :      Nominative Singular Feminine  
                         Neuter Plurals

Long :      Ablative Singular Feminine  
                         Imperative Singular

-is    Short :      Genitive Singular(3)  
                         Nominative Singular(3) e.g. civis

Long :      Dative and Ablative Plural(1/2)

-as/-es/-os are generally long

-i / -o / -u are generally long
